## FINAL DETERMINATION OF DEPARTMENT

In accordance with the Michigan Medical Marihuana Act (Initiated Law 1 of 2008) and 2009 AACS, R333.131, a petition was filed with the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs to consider adding Parkinson's Disease as a qualifying disease or medical condition to the list of debilitating medical conditions under 2009 AACS, R 333.101.

After discussion and public hearing, on April 5, 2013, the Medical Marihuana Review Panel voted 5-2 to recommend that Parkinson's disease be added to the list of debilitating conditions. The panel was comprised of 13 members. Pursuant to 2009 AACS, R 333.131(4), "a quorum of the review panel shall concur with the recommendation in order to be considered an official recommendation of the panel. For the purposes of this subrule, a majority of the members appointed and serving on the review panel constitutes a quorum."

For the reason that a quorum of the review panel did not concur in the recommendation, the petition to add Parkinson's Disease to the list of debilitating conditions is denied.
